

Niagara LaSalle Corporation - RoHS2 Directive Statement

Dear Valued Customer,

With respect to "RoHS2 Directive", Niagara LaSalle Corporation issues the following statement:

RoHS2 (2011/65/EU) went into effect in 2011 and is still the official RoHS directive. The 2015/863/EU amends Annex II of RoHS2 (2011/65/EU) to add 4 phthalates to the list of restricted substances. The restriction took effect from July 22, 2019 for electrical and electronic equipment (EEE) products. The 2015/863/EU amendment does not supersede RoHS2 (2011/65/EU), nor is it regarded as RoHS3.

Niagara LaSalle confirms that our products comply with the RoHS2 directive and does not use or introduce any of the items includes in Article 4(1) into its products. Annex III, line 6a states that the raw material, steel, is exempt from the lead restriction and can use lead as an alloying element up to 0.35% by weight for machinability purposes. Niagara LaSalle sells some products which can contain lead, such as grades having a "L" designation within the alloy type – i.e. 12L14.

Based on information from our suppliers and our manufacturing process, all our cold finish products are compliant with the threshold requirements of the RoHS2 Directive.
